SOWING & GROWING

A FIRST YEAR FLOWERING PERENNIALS

& HALF-HARDY PERENNIALS

Sowing time: January-March

Germination temperature: 18-20°C (65-68°F)

Days to germinate: 10-14

SOWING Sow onto a moist seed-sowing compost in a 576 to 150 cell plug tray or larger cell if preferred. Cover lightly with vermiculite to the depth of the seed and propagate at 18-20°C (65-68°F). Germination should take place after approximately 10-14 days depending on the variety.

GROWING ON Grow on at 15° C (60° F) reducing to 10° C (50° F) as the seedlings develop and fill the tray. When the plug plants are established - generally 6-8 weeks from sowing - pot on into 1 litre pots for sales in April-early May or pot 3 plugs into a 2 or 3 litre pot for later sales in flower in late June.

Note: All first-year-flowering perennials can also be treated as hardy perennials - see below.

B HARDY PERENNIALS AND BIENNIALS

Sowing time: May-July

Germination temperature: 18-20°C (65-68°F)

Days to germinate: 10-14

SOWING Sow onto a moist seed-sowing compost in a 576 to 150 cell plug tray or similar size unit. Cover seed with vermiculite to its own depth until no longer visible and propagate at 18-20°C (65-68°F). Germination should take place after 10-14 days. After germination maintain a temperature of 15°C (60°F) or as cool as possible depending on the weather conditions. Shade the seedlings from strong, direct sunlight.

GROWING ON Grow on the seedlings in a lightly shaded area until they are established and fill the tray. Pot on in late August-September into 1 litre pots, or put 3 plugs into 2 or 3 litre pots. Over-winter in a well-ventilated, unheated glasshouse or tunnel for sales the following March-April or for flowering plants ready to sell from early May-June.

SOWING & GROWING

HARDY ANNUALS

Sowing time: September and January-March **Germination temperature:** 15-20°C (60-68°F)

Days to germinate: 7-10

SOWING For best results multi sow 3 to 4 seeds per cell in a 150 cell plug tray or slightly larger unit. Sow on to the surface of a free-draining, moist seed-sowing compost and cover with 3-5mm (¼in) of vermiculite. Propagate at 15-20°C (60-68°F). Germination should take place in approximately 7-10 days. Maintain a temperature of 15°C (60°F) after germination until the seedlings are established. Alternatively sow direct into 12 packs, 9cm pots or preferred final unit of sale.

GROWING ON When the seedlings are established transfer the plugs into a 9cm pot or 6 pack. This should result in quality plants with a good display of flowers for sale from May onwards.

DIRECT SOW Sow direct into open ground in September or from March-June. The speed of germination will depend on the soil temperature and weather conditions and could be from 7 to 21 days. Sow the seed 2-3cm (¾-1¼in) deep in rows 60-90 cm (25-35in) apart depending on variety with a distance of 10-30 cm (4-12in) between the plants. Ensure all ground is weed free and well prepared before sowing.

HALF HARDY ANNUALS & VEGETABLES

Sowing time: February-April

Germination temperature: 20°C (68°F)

Days to germinate: 7-10

SOWING Sow onto the surface of a moist seed-sowing compost in a 576 to 150 cell plug tray depending on the variety or slightly larger unit if preferred. Cover with vermiculite to the depth of the seed until the seed is not visible and propagate at 20°C (68°F). Germination should take place after 7-10 days. Maintain a temperature of 15°C (60°F) for the seedlings after germination.

GROWING ON Continue to grow the seedlings on at 15°C (60°F) until they are established and fill the tray. Transfer to a 12 pack, 6 pack or 9-cm pot and continue to grow on at 10-15°C (50-60°F). Early February sowings will result in flowering plants for sale in late April-May. Later sowings made in April can be potted on into 1 litre pots for sales of more established flowering plants in late June. Use of the growth regulator B Nine will help to keep the plants compact.

F VIOLAS & PANSIES

Sowing time: January, June and September **Germination temperature:** 15-18°C (60-65°F)

Days to germinate: 7-10

SOWING Sow onto a moist seed-sowing compost in a 576 plug tray or similar size unit, cover lightly with vermiculite and propagate at 15-18°C (60-65°F). Germination should take place after 7-10 days. Sow in January for sales in April; in June for sales in September; and in September for over-wintering for sale in flower in early spring. Care should be taken with summer sowings to ensure that germination temperatures do not exceed 20°C (68°F) as this will reduce the rate of germination considerably.

GROWING ON Grow on the seedlings from the January sowings at 15°C (60°F) until they are established and cover the surface of the plug tray. Take care to grow quite cool to help avoid any stretching of the plants. Approximately 6 weeks from sowing transfer to a 12 pack, 6 pack or 9cm pot. January sowings should be ready for sale in early to mid April. If additional growth control is required then Cycocel can be applied, which will help to improve the quality and habit of the plants.

June sowings should be grown on as cool as possible, shaded from direct sunlight, and potted on as above. This will give plants for sale in flower from September onwards.

September sowings should be ready to be transferred to packs and pots in late October and held over winter in a well-ventilated, unheated glasshouse or tunnel for sale in flower in late February-early March.


Pansy and Viola can be susceptible to both powdery and downy mildew so always be vigilant for these diseases and treat promptly with the appropriate chemical.

No claims regarding germination can be accepted if made later than 60 days after delivery or 30 days from expected germination date [whichever is later]. No claims regarding quality of plants can be accepted if made later than 7 days after delivery. Seller accepts no liability whatsoever for any seed which has been repacked by the buyer.

c) Seeds or plants which we provide are intended only for use in or export to countries where their cultivation is permitted. It is the sole responsibility of the purchaser to ascertain and obey all laws, which apply to the possession and cultivation of any items listed in our catalogues or website, this includes plant irritation and toxicity. Please consult local, provisional and federal laws (including pertinent laws applied to your country) before placing an order. T&M does not assume any responsibility if customs or similar agencies confiscate seeds or plants. The risk of shipping falls on the customer.

d) For the avoidance of doubt, all liability whatsoever is excluded for any loss, expense or damage whether direct or consequential arising in any way whatsoever in connection with any products supplied by the company whether due to any failure in the performance of or any defect in any such products or otherwise save for the liability to replace or refund in b above. The price of all goods sold by us is based upon the foregoing limitations on our liability and would be much greater if a more extensive liability were required to be undertaken by us.

Minimum Order. The minimum order value will apply: please see the relevant price list. Each delivery or consignment shall stand as a separate contract.

Crop Shortage. In the event of a product shortage we reserve the right to fulfil or pro-rate orders on a first come, first served basis or cancel the contract without liability to either party. In the event of cancellation, we will credit any payment already made by the customer.

Payment. Sterling, Euro and US Dollar online and faxed orders will require payment by credit or debit card which shall be debited on receipt of order to reserve the products. The customer agrees to indemnify the seller against any loss, damages and costs or expenses incurred by the seller arising from any non-compliance with these requirements. The customer agrees that they will ensure that their terms of sale protect the seller's rights as detailed here, throughout the supply chain.
