Instead of having separate petals like most cosmos, all petals are fused into one single cup, completely changing the normally daisy-looking flower. Since then our breeders have been busy fixing the unusual trait across different colours, developing new shades and refining the habit of this uniquely shaped 'cupcake' cosmos.

### FIRST YEAR FLOWERING PERENNIALS & HALF-HARDY PERENNIALS

Sowing time: January-March

**Germination temperature:** 18-20°C (65-68°F)

Days to germinate: 10-14

**SOWING** Sow onto a moist seed-sowing compost in a 576 to 150 cell plug tray or larger cell if preferred. Cover lightly with vermiculite to the depth of the seed and propagate at 18-20°C (65-68°F). Germination should take place after approximately 10-14 days depending on the variety.

**GROWING ON** Grow on at 15°C (60°F) reducing to 10°C (50°F) as the seedlings develop and fill the tray. When the plug plants are established - generally 6-8 weeks from sowing - pot on into 1 litre pots for sales in April-early May or pot 3 plugs into a 2 or 3 litre pot for later sales in flower in late June.

Note: All first-year-flowering perennials can also be treated as hardy perennials - see below.

#### HARDY PERENNIALS AND BIENNIALS В

Sowing time: May-July

**Germination temperature:** 18-20°C (65-68°F)

Days to germinate: 10-14

**SOWING** Sow onto a moist seed-sowing compost in a 576 to 150 cell plug tray or similar size unit. Cover seed with vermiculite to its own depth until no longer visible and propagate at 18-20°C (65-68°F). Germination should take place after 10-14 days. After germination maintain a temperature of 15°C (60°F) or as cool as possible depending on the weather conditions. Shade the seedlings from strong, direct sunlight.

GROWING ON Grow on the seedlings in a lightly shaded area until they are established and fill the tray. Pot on in late August-September into 1 litre pots, or put 3 plugs into 2 or 3 litre pots. Over-winter in a well-ventilated, unheated glasshouse or tunnel for sales the following March-April or for flowering plants ready to sell from early May-June.

### HARDY ANNUALS

**Sowing time:** September and January-March **Germination temperature:** 15-20°C (60-68°F)

Days to germinate: 7-10

**SOWING** For best results multi sow 3 to 4 seeds per cell in a 150 cell plug tray or slightly larger unit. Sow on to the surface of a free-draining, moist seed-sowing compost and cover with 3-5mm (¼in) of vermiculite. Propagate at 15-20°C (60-68°F). Germination should take place in approximately 7-10 days. Maintain a temperature of 15°C (60°F) after germination until the seedlings are established. Alternatively sow direct into 12 packs, 9cm pots or preferred final unit of sale.

**GROWING ON** When the seedlings are established transfer the plugs into a 9cm pot or 6 pack. This should result in quality plants with a good display of flowers for sale from May onwards.

**DIRECT SOW** Sow direct into open ground in September or from March-June. The speed of germination will depend on the soil temperature and weather conditions and could be from 7 to 21 days. Sow the seed 2-3cm [%-1½in] deep in rows 60-90 cm [25-35in] apart depending on variety with a distance of 10-30 cm [4-12in] between the plants. Ensure all ground is weed free and well prepared before sowing.



### **HALF HARDY ANNUALS & VEGETABLES**

Sowing time: February-April

Germination temperature: 20°C (68°F)

Days to germinate: 7-10

**SOWING** Sow onto the surface of a moist seed-sowing compost in a 576 to 150 cell plug tray depending on the variety or slightly larger unit if preferred. Cover with vermiculite to the depth of the seed until the seed is not visible and propagate at 20°C [68°F]. Germination should take place after 7-10 days. Maintain a temperature of 15°C [60°F] for the seedlings after germination.

**GROWING ON** Continue to grow the seedlings on at  $15^{\circ}$ C ( $60^{\circ}$ F) until they are established and fill the tray. Transfer to a 12 pack, 6 pack or 9-cm pot and continue to grow on at  $10-15^{\circ}$ C ( $50-60^{\circ}$ F). Early February sowings will result in flowering plants for sale in late April-May. Later sowings made in April can be potted on into 1 litre pots for sales of more established flowering plants in late June. Use of the growth regulator B Nine will help to keep the plants compact.



### **VIOLAS & PANSIES**

**Sowing time:** January, June and September **Germination temperature:** 15-18°C (60-65°F)

Days to germinate: 7-10

**SOWING** Sow onto a moist seed-sowing compost in a 576 plug tray or similar size unit, cover lightly with vermiculite and propagate at 15-18°C (60-65°F). Germination should take place after 7-10 days. Sow in January for sales in April; in June for sales in September; and in September for over-wintering for sale in flower in early spring. Care should be taken with summer sowings to ensure that germination temperatures do not exceed 20°C (68°F) as this will reduce the rate of germination considerably.

**GROWING ON** Grow on the seedlings from the January sowings at 15°C (60°F) until they are established and cover the surface of the plug tray. Take care to grow quite cool to help avoid any stretching of the plants. Approximately 6 weeks from sowing transfer to a 12 pack, 6 pack or 9cm pot. January sowings should be ready for sale in early to mid April. If additional growth control is required then Cycocel can be applied, which will help to improve the quality and habit of the plants.

June sowings should be grown on as cool as possible, shaded from direct sunlight, and potted on as above. This will give plants for sale in flower from September onwards.

September sowings should be ready to be transferred to packs and pots in late October and held over winter in a well-ventilated, unheated glasshouse or tunnel for sale in flower in late February-early March.

Pansy and Viola can be susceptible to both powdery and downy mildew so always be vigilant for these diseases and treat promptly with the appropriate chemical.



#### **HELLEBORUS**

Sowing time: June

Germination temperature: Outdoors - see below

Days to germinate: 150 - 200

**SOWING** Sow Helleborus seed in June using fresh seed from new crop. Sow on to a free-draining, moist compost and cover with 3-5mm (1/4in) of coarse grit. The best germination results are achieved by allowing the seed to germinate naturally in a shaded area, either a cold frame or netted tunnel. Check regularly and keep moist and weed free. Germination can be erratic: seedlings will begin to emerge in November as temperatures cool and the bulk of seedlings will emerge during early to mid December. At this stage the seedlings can be moved under cover to an area at 5-10°C (40-50°F) and pricked out.

**GROWING ON** Prick out the seedlings into 150 cell plug trays using a well-drained compost and grow on at  $10^{\circ}$ C ( $50^{\circ}$ F). Over-winter the seedlings in a well-ventilated glasshouse maintaining a temperature of 5-10 $^{\circ}$ C ( $40^{\circ}$ 50 $^{\circ}$ F). The plugs will develop and be ready for potting in late April. Pot in 7-9cm pots and grow on outdoors, preferably in a netted tunnel, for sales in late summer or pot on again into 3 litre pots and over-winter for sales the following year.



In the event of non-arrival of goods within 14 days of order, please advise us enabling us time to follow up the matter within the carriers' normal terms of 28 days. Customers should not return products to us without first obtaining authorisation and shipping instructions.

Title and Risk. Until paid for in full, all goods supplied by us shall remain our property. Risk passes to the buyer on shipment of the goods. Any dispute which may arise to be settled by arbitration in accordance with the rules of the United Kingdom Agricultural Supply Trade Association Limited (UKASTA).

Crop Shortage. In the event of a product shortage we reserve the right to fulfil or pro-rate orders on a first come, first served basis or cancel the contract without liability to either party. In the event of cancellation, we will credit any payment already made by the customer.

Payment. Sterling, Euro and US Dollar online and faxed orders will require payment by credit or debit card which shall be debited on receipt of order to reserve the products. Orders by post may be accompanied by credit or debit card details or a cheque made payable to Thompson & Morgan. We will accept cheques drawn in the following currencies: Sterling, Euro and US Dollars. [US and Canadian customers will be required to pay in US Dollars].

Credit Accounts. We will agree to consider credit facilities for larger customers. Credit accounts are due within 30 days of invoice and we reserve the right to charge interest on overdue accounts at 3% above the Bank of England base rate. We may refuse to execute new orders if overdue accounts remain outstanding. In the event that a customer (a) has a liquidator or receiver appointed in respect to any property or business undertaking, (b) announces that it has ceased or will be ceasing to trade, (c) notifies any creditor that it is unable to pay debts as they fall due, (d) calls or hold a meeting of creditors, (e) commits an act of bankruptcy or is adjudicated bankrupt or has an administration order made, (f) enters into any arrangements with its creditors or (g) suffers distress or execution to be levied on the buyer's property, then not withstanding any previous arrangements for deferred settlement, all sums payable to us by the buyer shall become immediately due and we have the right (without prejudice to any right or remedy available to us) to cancel or suspend

Protection of Seller's Rights. The customer agrees that seed or plants are sold for the express purpose of onward sale as seed or plants and NOT for seed crop multiplication. The buyer agrees to comply at all times with the requirements of the Plant Varieties and Seeds Act 1964 (as amended) in so far as they relate to the protection of the seller's Plant Breeder Rights in seeds and plants. The customer agrees that the products shall be supplied for its sole use. The customer agrees not to export the seed or plants from the territory in which the customer is resident. The customer agrees to indemnify the seller against any loss, damages and costs or expenses incurred by the seller arising from any noncompliance with these requirements. The customer agrees that they will ensure that their terms of sale protect the seller's rights as detailed here, throughout the supply chain. Acceptance of Terms. The giving or a sending of an order to us constitutes an acceptance of these terms by the purchaser. If the purchaser does not accept these terms, the goods must be returned forthwith.
